BOARD MEETING MINUTES: Meeting was called to order by Treasurer April Campbell; show report summary was given. Regional show logistics were discussed as well as the need for parking attendants, signage, entry packets, advertising options and the need for small focus committees. It was decided to bring these topics to the general meeting. Grounds improvements were discussed and the need for work parties prior to the October Swap Meet to bring water to the BR245 building and start the saw mill project. Meeting and work party dates will be open to the general meeting to decide. Members in attendance Ken Christensen, Dale Fye, Brian Edwards, Ed Murphy, Jim Beeler, April Campbell.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES: Flag Salute was lead by Evie with 38 members in attendance. Old Business included the sawmill building and the mill itself. A work party date was set for Oct. 13th with the following Saturday as a rain out date. George Rhoads, Brian Edwards and Ed Murphy discussed ideas, consulted on footings and the lumber pile was looked over. We have had much lumber donated over the last year by Mike King and his partner as well as our club's friends Tom and Evonne; a great start- if you think you may have boards, nails, screws you could contribute please call Dale; Evie says she has some boards the club can look at. A large cedar log was donated by John Castle for making shakes and Ken Christensen will help us get the shakes made for the building. A rumor was discussed and will hopefully come to fruition that some old logging memorabilia with local history is coming our way for permanent display in and around this future building. Carl Ogle, Jim Beeler and Charles Skillman discussed the mill parts and workings at length. The treasurer reported profit from the spring swap meet with kudos to the flower committee and repeat vendors; profit at the show with thanks to all and the Huff's for the nice donation can they made for the gate. A financial report is available to any member at any club meeting. October is the meeting that the treasurer's books are audited each year if you'd like to be a part of the audit please see Dale at the meeting. New business included the Regional show and the members in attendance agreed unanimously that the show was a great idea. It was voted on to hold it Friday, Saturday and Sunday making our 2019 Show dates July 12,13 and 14 2019. Renaming our show was brought to the floor and advertising will need to be in multiple outlets by Nov. 1st so this needs to be decided shortly. Features also need to be decided upon and included in advertising; Brian Edwards suggested Air cooled Engines, working displays was mentioned as well. Please bring your feature suggestions to the next meeting so we can vote. Some of the questions brought up about the regional show were: What is our expected percentage of increased participation from exhibitors, the public, members? The consensus was; We don't know. A committee was formed to do advertising; April, Tammy, Francette and Jenny – Judy will also be advising. Dale said advertising was discussed in length with Morrie at the Lynden Show and some good ideas were obtained. Dale discussed parking and mowing and having a bulldozer come in to work on the camping roads. He called out for help with a second people mover, a kiddy train that can be edgeta approved, donations for exhibitor packets, and ideas/ contact a nonprofit club to help with parking and for you to bring any ideas for a better show to the next meeting. ABOUT THE EDGE&TA HALL OF FAME

History The EDGE&TA Hall of Fame was established in 1998 in the interest of honoring those who have made significant contributions to the collection, preservation, and exhibition of antique tractors, engines, and equipment.

Every EDGE&TA member is eligible for this award. Posthumous submissions will be accepted with past EDGE&TA membership,

Each year the inductees to the hall of Fame will receive their award in the form of a plaque with their name on it. The announcement of the year's inductees will be made at the National business meeting unless other arrangements are made. This award will be presented to them at the National or Regional Show of their choice. A stand-in can accept the award if the inductee is unable to attend. Their name will be put on the large Hall of Fame plaque that EDGE&TA keeps along with the previous years inductees. Their names along with their applications will then be put on our web site for all to view.

At the September 9, 2000, board of directors meeting the following changes were voted on and approved: (1) the number of inductees will be limited to four, (2) all inductees must be an EDGE&TA member, (3) posthumous submissions will be accepted with past EDGE&TA membership.

At the June 22, 2001, board of directors meeting the following changes were voted on and approved: (1) all nominees must receive a minimum of 2 votes from the judges to be considered for induction into the Hall of Fame, (2) the judges will be chosen by the Hall of Fame Chairman and will remain anonymous, (3) inductees will receive a personal engraved plaque commemorating their induction into the Hall of Fame, (4) the plaque will be presented during the business meeting at either the National or Regional Show that the inductee can attend. A stand in can accept the award if the inductee is unable to attend.

At the June 12, 2009, board of directors meeting the following changes were voted on and approved: (1) the number of inductees will be open as long as each inductee receives two votes, (2) add the following to the application – What has the nominee done for EDGE&TA, (3) in an effort to have all applications judged equally the following application guideline is added and should be followed.

At the August 2012 board of directors meeting the following change was voted on and approved – The deadline for the hall of Fame nomination application was changed from April 14 to one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the meeting at the National Show of the year the nominee is to be considered.

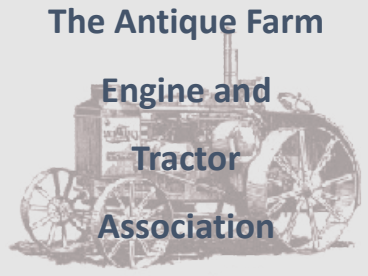

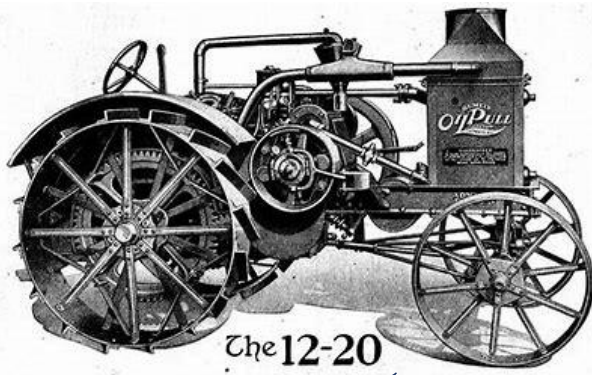
